Course Objectives: Dept. Of English

ENG/I/FC/I: ENGLISH I (Course I- FC)

- 1. To improve the students' grasp of grammar through re-acquaintance with the basic grammar rules of English.
- 2. To improve the students' comprehension of the language and its general usage.
- 3. To help them develop fundamental writing skills.
- 4. To enhance the communicative skills through mock interviews, seminars, and presentations.

ENG/ II/FC/2: ENGLISH II (Course II -FC)

- 1. To enable students to improve their reading with comprehension, and speak and write correct English.
- 2. To enable students to recognize and acquire different elements of the English language like structures, vocabulary, spelling, pronunciation, punctuation, and articulation.
- 3. To develop the imagination and creativity of the students.
- 4. To enhance their skills in judgement, reasoning, interpretation, and appreciation.
- 5. To provide opportunities for self-expression through discussions, presentations, and seminars.

ENG/III/FC/3: Alternative English: Course I- FC

HISTORY OF ENGLISH LITERATURE

- 1. To acquaint students with the different ages in the history of English literature.
- 2. To give perspective to works of literature in English through an understanding of the social background in which the works were written.
- 3. To instill an appreciation of literature in the students by foregrounding literary works by the time and cultural space they were written in.
- 4. To trace the development of different genres of literature and their relation to social, economic, and political changes.

ENG/II/CC/ 2: Elective Core Subject 2: Course II-CC

HISTOY OF THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE & PHONETICS

- 1. To help students understand the changes in the English language from Old English to present day English and help them situate those in their socio-political contexts.
- 2. To help students understand why the language has a particular grammatical structure or phonological rules by familiarizing them with the change in language over time.
- 3. To develop in the students a critical perspective of how linguistic changes might be linked to historical contexts, especially in terms of socio-political factors.

ENG/III/CC/3: Elective Core Subject 3: Course III-CC

POETRY & SHORT STORIES

- 1. To develop the imagination and creativity of the students.
- 2. To help the students discover how literature makes sense of the world through stories and poems.
- 3. To enhance their skills in judgement, reasoning, interpretation, and appreciation.
- 4. To understand regional literature translated or written in English.
- 5. To create awareness among the students of the richness and diversity of Northeast Indian cultures.

ENG/IV/CC/4: Elective core Subject 4: Course IV -EC

FICTION I

- 1. To acquaint students with the rise and development of the novel.
- 2. To educate students on the effects of social, economic, and political changes in society and how that affects literature.
- 3. To enrich the students understanding of the human condition through stories of ordinary people narrated in a realistic manner.

ENG/V/CC/5: Major Core- Course 5 (CC-5):

V DRAMA I

- 1. To enable the students to gain an insight into the growth and development of the British drama.
- 2. To understand the style, structure, and theme in British Drama.
- 3. To expose them to the features of the Elizabethan morality plays and tragedies.
- 4. To familiarize students to irony and humour as a literary tool through the Restoration Comedies.

ENG/VI/CC/6: Major Core- Course 6 (CC-6):

WOMENS WRITINGS

- 1. To introduce to the students the distinct body of literature written by women which is complex and multifaceted, depicting life from a woman's perspective.
- 2. To acquaint students to and help them understand the diversity of women's experiences.
- 3. To understand the predicament of women in a patriarchal society through the perspective of women themselves.
- 4. To expose students to gender politics and womens' rights.
- 5. To acquaint students with the revolutionary changes that occurred due to women empowerment.
- 6. To shape their understanding of the role of women in society.

ENG/VII/CC/7: Major Core – Course 7 (CC-7):

LITERARY THEORY AND CRITICISM

- 1. To introduce students to the importance of literary theories in the study of literature.
- 2. To familiarize students with the classical and neo-classical literary theories.
- 3. To enable students to apply these literary theories to their interpretation of literary works.
- 4. To help students gain perception and develop critical thinking.

ENG/ VIII/CC/8: Major Core –Course 8 (CC-8)

POPULAR STUDIES (Option B)

- 1. To enrich the students' knowledge of Popular culture and its implication.
- 2. To understand the mood of anti-establishment and rebellion of counterculture movements and expressing the dreams and aspirations of youth culture through songs.
- 3. To introduce the study of popular music as a form of protest through the study of the culture which produces the songs.
