Red Ribbon is the global symbol created in 1991 in New York. It stands for Solidarity with people living with HIV/ AIDS and aimed at uniting the people in a common fight against the disease. Red stand for Love – as a symbol of passion and tolerance for those affected. Red stand for blood representing pain caused by death of people by AIDS. Red stands for sign of warning- not to ignore one of the biggest problems of the World.

The Red Ribbon Club (RRC) Govt. J.Buana College was formed on 28th June 2006. The main objectives of Red Ribbon Clubs are -

- 1. To reduce new HIV infection among young people by raising their risk perception through their educational skills and to create awareness on sexuality and HIV/ AIDS.
- 2. To induce among the youth the spirit to help and support HIV/AIDS and reducing stigma and discrimination against AIDS patient.
- 3. To motivate students to build their skills on leadership, negotiation and team building.
 - 4. To involve actively in voluntary blood donation.
