The College

Government J. Buana College, Lunglei was established on 26 August 1983 and was provincialised by the Government of Mizoram on October 2007. It is permanently affiliated to Mizoram University and is now 2f and 12b category under UGC. It is also an accredited "B" college under NAAC.

The institution is named after the late Shri J. Buana, a Padma Shree Awardee who came up with a handsome donation of Two Lakh Rupees for its management at its infant stage. At its inception, Government J Buana College had classes in the early hours of the morning at Mizoram Polytechnic Building, Bazar Veng, Lunglei. The then Principal, Pu Thanseia, provided a single room for use as an office. The office began with a donation of tables, chairs, steel almirahs and typewriters from the District Commissioner. Also, an LDC was appointed to work in the office.

As the college had no land to occupy, classes were taken in the Mizoram Polytechnic Building for an extended period of time. The governing body and the pioneering professors of the college devoted their time and energy into acquiring land for the college. Meanwhile, the Mizoram Polytechnic was soon to move to their permanent campus in Hrangchawkawn; therefore, deliberations were made to procure the Mizoram Polytechnic land in Bazar Veng. A proposal was made to the Government and additional measures were taken to obtain the land. Although suggestions to purchase land on the outskirts of the town were put forth, it was decided that it was detrimental to a newly-established college to start on the outskirts for fear of shortage of students.

Considering that the Mizoram Polytechnic building and land is situated in the middle of the town, efforts to secure the land finally paid off. An order was issued by Pu Denghnuna IAS, the then Secretary of Education, who stated: "As soon as the Polytechnic moves out, the land and all the buildings are to be inherited by J. Buana College."

Being established to cater to the needs of the locality and the poorer sections for higher education, it is providing education to hundreds of students. Most of the graduates from this college are able to find employment in various services within and outside the state.

Government J. Buana College is centrally located at the heart of Lunglei. Its close proximity to a major arterial road means that it is only a few minutes away from any part of the town. There are a number of shops and amenities in the vicinity which students can make use of after their classes are over.

The campus is divided into four blocks: The Academic Block - I which contains the Students' Day Home, Board of Examinations Office, IGNOU Office, Library Extension, RSETI and Classrooms. The Administrative Block houses the Principal's Office, Administrative Office, Library and Seminar Hall. The Academic Block - II contains the Multipurpose Hall, Faculty Common Room, Classrooms and a Garage. The Academic Annexe contains the Computer Laboratory, College Canteen and Storage Room.

Library

The College Central Library has around 8500+ books, 12 journals and references. All the books are automated using SOUL 2.0 which is designed and developed by Information and Library Network (INFLIBNET), an organization that promotes and facilitates libraries and information resources for higher education in India. Each student will be given a Student ID Card cum Library Card which will have a record of the books borrowed. Students will be allowed to borrow a maximum number of two books at a given time. Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) can be used for students and staff for searching their desired books. All the departments of the college also have their respective Departmental Libraries where a number of books of the concerned subjects are kept.

IGNOU Study Centre

The Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) Study Centre was started in the college in August 2009. The Office is situated at the Ground Floor of the Academic Block - I. Admissions for Bachelor's and Master's degrees as well as Certificate and Post-Graduate Diploma courses are done twice a year at January and July cycles.



N-LIST

The library resource has been enriched by e-resources provided by INFLIBNET Centre which the college community has access to an additional 6,000 e-journals and 1,06,000 e-books under the National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content (N-List). The programme was funded by the MHRD under NMEICT to extend access to selected e-resources to colleges covered under Section 12B of UGC Act as well as Non-Aided Colleges during from 2010-2013.

Colles ERP System

Starting from the academic session 2022-2023, the college has adopted Colles ERP (Enterprise Resource Planning) System for the integrated management of academic and non-academic activities. Colles is an Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) System made for colleges to deal with paperless administration for the institutions. Its main objective is to provide an efficient system for colleges who need to manage all the data related to their institution with an easy and secure software from anywhere around the world. Through this system, students as well as parents are able to have real-time access of their academic records through the iPhone and Android apps. The application also provides numerous services for students such as leave application, view attendance, view and download study materials etc. Users can access these data from any platform including mobile and desktop systems via an internet browser or through the app.

Major Courses

These are the disciplines or subjects of main focus which provide the opportunity for students to pursue in-depth study of a particular discipline or subject and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure at least 50% of the total credits in the major discipline. All major courses will be of 4 credits each.

Minor Courses

Students will have the option to choose other disciplinary/interdisciplinary course and skill-based courses relating to a chosen vocational education programme as minor. Students who take prescribed number of courses in a discipline or interdisciplinary area of study other than the chosen major will qualify for a minor in that discipline or the chosen interdisciplinary area of study. All minor courses will also be of 4 credits each.

Multidisciplinary Courses

All students are required to undergo three introductory-level courses relating to any of the following broad disciplines. Students are not allowed to choose courses already taken at higher secondary level in the proposed major and minor stream under this category. All courses under multidisciplinary will be of 3 credits each.



Ability Enhancement Courses (Language and Communication Skill Courses)

Students are required to achieve competency in Modern Indian Language (MIL) and in English language with special emphasis on language and communication skills. The courses aim at enabling the students to acquire and demonstrate the core linguistic skills, including critical reading and expository and academic writing skills. The courses under this category will be assigned 2 or 3 credits as appropriate.

Skill Enhancement Courses

These courses are aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, soft skills, etc., to enhance the employability of students. Courses will be designed as per students' needs and available institutional resources. Each of the Skill Enhancement courses will be assigned 3 credits.

Value Added Courses

These are courses common to all UG students. All UG students are required to take the following courses under the category of value-added courses. Each course under this category will be of 2 credits.

Admission Criteria

Eligibility

- (a) Pass in the Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate (HSSLC) Examination or its equivalent conducted by any recognised Board of a State or Central Government.
- (b) Candidates passing with vocational courses, the equivalence may be decided by the College authority.

Reservation of Seats

Reservation of seats for SC, ST and OBC candidates will be based on rules laid down by Government of India from time to time.

Free Admission

Candidates who have passed their Higher Secondary School Leaving Certificate (HSSLC) Examinations in Distinction Division can avail free admission at the college.





Mentoring System

The institution is student-centric rather than teacher-centric. The Mentoring System was started with the objective of uplifting the students, not just in the academic sphere, but also in the social and personal sphere. It also strives to improve the work culture of the students and create better teacher-student relationship. Each teacher is assigned as a mentor to a group of their core students at the beginning of a semester. Through the mentoring system, each individual teacher identifies slow learners and advanced learners by means of internal and

mentor is required to maintain a Student's Profile Booklet for each individual student. The slow learners and advanced learners are identified through the same. Students are given guidance and help in areas in which they require assistance. Mentor-Ward meetings are conducted at regular intervals. Mentor-Parent/ Guardian meetings are also conducted to facilitate parents' and guardians' involvement in the students' academic progress. Students with problems are counselled and given encouragement and assistance.

Add-On Courses

The college conducts courses in Spoken English, Spoken Hindi, Course on Computer Concepts (CCC), Certified Office Automation and IT Assistant (COAITA), and Personal Development Course. These courses are initiated for skill and ability enhancement of the students. Specific time-slots are given for these add-on classes and are incorporated in the weekly time-table.



HDFC Bank RSETI

Government J. Buana College has signed a Memorandum of Understanding with HDFC Bank. Under the terms of this MOU, HDFC operates its Rural Self-Employment Training Institute (RSETI) at the college premises. The institute offers a number of short-term skill-based courses such as Women's Tailoring, House Wiring, Beauty Culture, and plans to introduce a plethora of other courses in the near future. These courses are intended to equip students with skill sets to empower them towards self-employment.

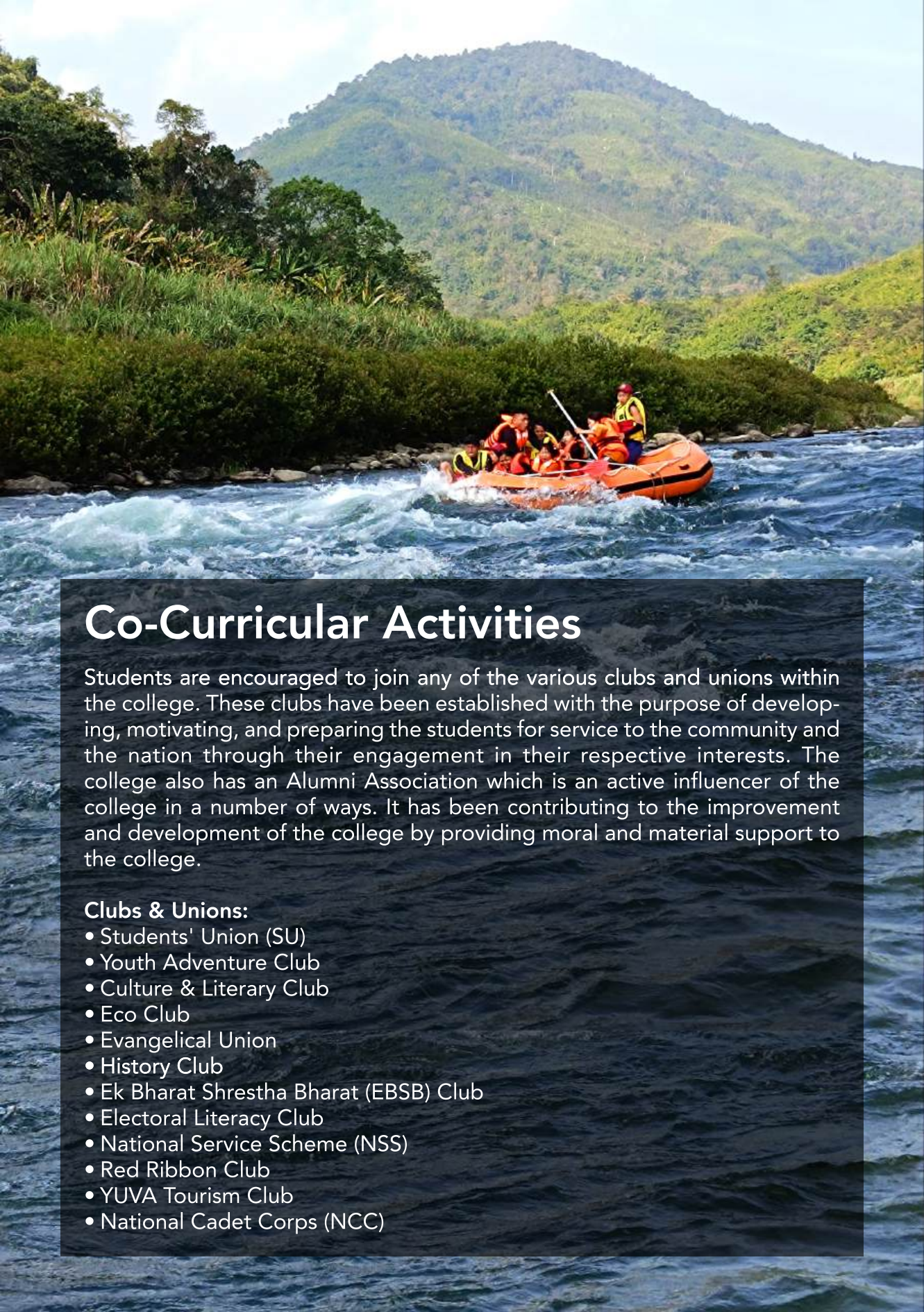
All the courses as well as hostel accommodation are provided free of cost.

Valedictory Day

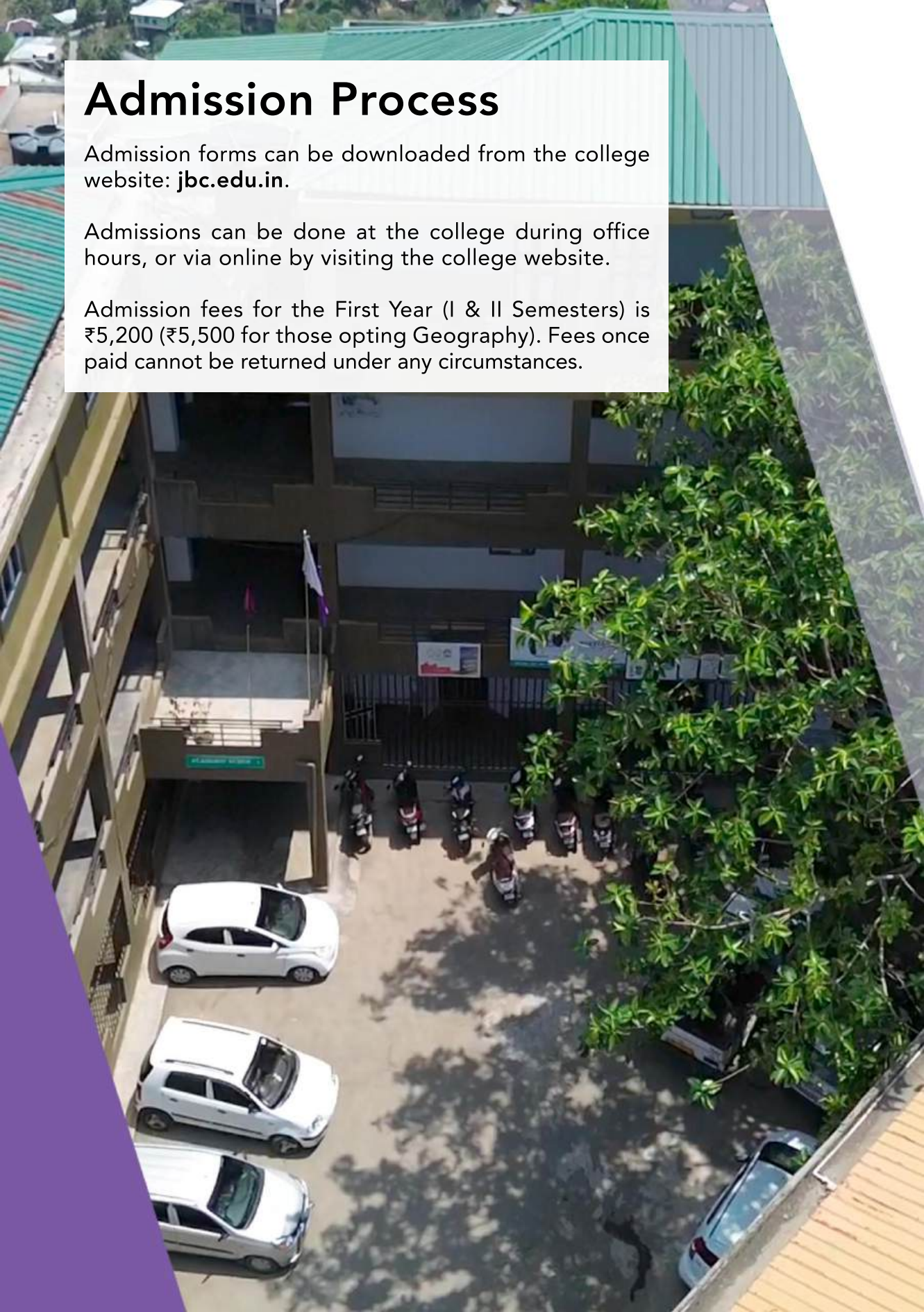
